#### National Eagle Center

There is no better place in America to learn about the majestic bald eagle. Watch wild bald eagles from a wide bank of windows o verlooking a pool on the Mississippi River.

### **Great River Road Visitor & Learning Center**

Perched high above the river valley, this site gives a snapshot of the entire region. Use the center's spotting scopes to watch eagles, raptors and other birds year-round.

#### **Hurstville Interpretive Center**

This center is an excellent place to view wildlife. The property offers prairies and wetlands and is a particularly good location for birdwatching. You'll find walking trails as well as blinds for wildlife viewing.

# **Mississippi River Visitor Center**

Located in Rock Island at Lock & Dam #15, this center provides views of the many bald eagles that travel to the locks and dams of the Mississippi to feed during the winter.

#### Pere Marquette State Park Visitor Center

The 8,000-acre park offers spectacular views of the Illinois River and its backwaters from several points atop the bluffs. The visitor center includes exhibits on wildlife habitat and geology.

#### Cape Girardeau Conservation Nature Center

This outstanding birdwatching destination attracts songbirds, shorebirds and waterfowl as they make their way down the Mississippi River Flyway during spring and fall migrations. Bald eagles are a common sight.
